Cyclosporine is a metabolite extracted from the fungus *Tolypocladium*. 4. It is a potent suppressor of the immune system, particularly T-lymphocytes. 2. Cyclosporine is a P-gp substrate, based on in vitro reports in caco-2, MDR1-transfected LLC-PK or MDCK cells. The drug interactions reported to occur with cyclosporine and P-gp inhibitors such as verapamil or diltiazem may be partially mediated by P-gp modulation at the absorption site, leading to an increase in cyclosporine levels.

Cyclosporine is non-cytotoxic. It inhibits T-helper cell activity and shifts the regulation of the immune response towards immune tolerance.
